
Cirencester to Stroud

- 1 Join Sheep Street and head south continuing out of Cirencester and taking the bridge over the A429 Bristol Road.
- 2 At Crossroads TL and continue along CHESTERTON LANE.
- 3 At roundabout TL along MIDLAND ROAD.
- 4 At mini roundabout TR along BRIDGE ROAD.
- 5 Junction with grassed triangle and bus stop TR.
- 6 At second grassed triangle bear left.
- At T junction TR then turn first left.
- 8 At grassed triangle T junction TR, then immediate left SP SOMERFORD KEYS.

- 9 Follow track with SP. NEIGHBRIDGE COUNTRY PARK and at end of track reioin carriageway straight on.
- 10 At mini roundabout TL SP EASTCOURT.
- At crossroads TR SP CRUDWELL/CIRENCESTER
- At T junction TL SP CHIPPENHAM/MALMESBURY.
- 13 TR SP CHEDGLOW/ASHLEY/LONG NEWNTON taking care to cross the A429

- At T junction TL SP TETBURY.
- 15 At T junction TR SP TETBURY.
- 6 At Marketplace Roundabout carry straight on direction CIRENCESTER/DURSI EY/AVENING.
- 77 At spreading crossroads carry straight on (Bearing Left) SP AVENING.
- 1 TL along CHAVENAGE LANE.
- 19 Turn Right.
- At Cross roads go straight over. Care crossing
- At T junction TL. Descent on narrow lane. Beware of oncoming traffic.
- At village green TL SP AVENING.
- Turn second right SP HAMPTON FIELDS/STROUD.
- At Crossroads go straight over SP MINCHINHAMPTON ONLY. Care crossing B4014.
- Direction straight on through village.
- 26 At T junction TR SP STROUD/CIRENCESTER.
- At T junction TL SP RODBOROUGH/STROUD.
- Speed aware Steep descent on narrow lane. Beware of oncoming traffic.
- At traffic lighted crossroads TL.

Cirencester to Stroud

Starting from Cirencester which is a must see thriving market town at the heart of The Cotswolds with ancient Roman origins. The Corinium museum showcases the finest Roman collection so leave the 21st Century behind and discover the treasures and history of The Cotswolds.

Cirencester mixes old with new having a vibrant arts centre with workshops, Britain's oldest open air swimming pool and beautiful abbey grounds. The amazing selection of independent shops and restaurants sit alongside the 'woolgothic' church, which dominates the marketplace. The route takes you to the The Cotswold Water Park area which dominates the South Cotswolds offering an incredible resource for leisure, sports, walks and even an inland beach around 150 lakes.

The route moves through quiet lanes onto Tetbury which has in the heart of the town a market house dating back to 17th century used for the sale of wool and yarn. The town has many beautiful and historic buildings and the skyline is dominated by the magnificent spire of the Parish Church of St Mary the Virgin.





You will drop into Stroud from the lofty heights of the Stroud commons which give some beautiful views. Stroud itself is brimming with independent shops, cafes, galleries and a lovely museum and is home to one of the best farmers markets in the country. Stroud is well known as a centre for contemporary arts, as well as its canal, commons, woollen mill heritage and colourful festivals.
