Discover the inspirational houses and gardens like Kelmscott Manor created by those behind the Arts and Crafts Movement; wonderful backdrops for film sets such as Chavenage and Chastleton. Travel back in time on the Gloucestershire to Warwickshire steam railway or visit the fascinating Tewkesbury Heritage Centre, Oxford Bus Museum or the Fashion Museum in Bath for a taste of life in times gone by. HISTORIC HOUSES & GARDENS

Batsford Arboretum

Batsford is home to one of the country's largest private tree collections with 56 acres of wild gardens, paths, streams and stunning views. Enjoy early colour from snowdrops, spring-flowering bulbs and Japanese flowering cherries; escape the heat under the tree canopy in summer and prepare to be amazed by the outstanding autumn colour!

This stunning medieval castle has been the home of the Berkeley family since 1153. Elizabeth I stayed here and Edward II was murdered here. 



Kelmscott Manor was the iconic country home of William Morris; poet, designer, craftsman, socialist and founding father of the Arts and Crafts Movement. This Grade I listed house contains a collection of the possessions and works of Morris and his associates including furniture, textiles and ceramics. Surrounded by attractive gardens, restaurant, shop and exhibition barn.

Kenilworth Castle

A vast medieval fortress which became an Elizabethan palace, the castle is rich in associations with medieval monarchs particularly with King Henry VIII. 












Charlbury






Stow-on-the-Wold




