

- TR SP ASTHALL LEIGH.
- (8) TR SP MINSTER LOVELL/WITNEY.
- At T junction TR SP MINSTER LOVELL/BRIZE NORTON.
- 1 TL SP MINSTER LOVELL HALL.
- 11 At T junction TR SP CRAWLEY/WITNEY.
- 12 TL SP FINSTOCK/CHARLBURY then take immediate RIGHT TURN.

- At crossroads straight over SP LEAFIELD. Care crossing the B4437.

- 28 At junction TR SP LEAFIELD.
- At T junction TR SP MINSTER LOVELL/SHIPTON-LINDER-WYCHWOOD.
- 30 TR SP FORDWELLS/ASTHALL LEIGH.
- 31 At T junction TL SP ASTHALL LEIGH/SWINBROOK.
- 32 TR SP SWINBROOK.
- 33 At T junction TR SP SWINBROOK/BURFORD.
- 34 TL
- 35 At T junction TL SP BURFORD.
- At mini roundabout TL and proceed back to BURFORD HIGH STREET.



## Burford East Circular

Nestling along the slope of the hill down through the trees to the River Windrush, Burford is steeped in history and rich in architectural heritage. Burford is full of Cotswold stone houses with hidden secrets that can be glimpsed through narrow alleyways and courtyards. One of the oldest buildings in Burford is a magnificent church of almost cathedral-like proportions. It was built from around 1175. The town is also a renowned centre for the antiques trade.

The route winds its way through Cotswold villages including Asthall Leigh, North Leigh to Charlbury. Set in the Evenlode Valley the market town of Charlbury grew from a small clearing in the Wychwood Forest to a prosperous market town, due largely to its reputation as a glove making centre during the 18th and 19th centuries.

This town is full of fascination and wonder, combining rural charm with bustling town life. The railway station, serving the London to Worcester mainline, and a regular bus service to Oxford make Charlbury a popular and accessible location for visitors. There are a number of places for food and drink in Charlbury, a small museum, and a number of specialist independent shops.

The route goes past Cornbury Park which was originally one of the royal hunting lodges for the Wychwood Forest. The present house, mainly 16th and 17th century, is not open to the public but hosts a number of public events including the Wilderness Festival.

Coming back to Burford the route gives you some beautiful rural views and quiet country roads to experience.
