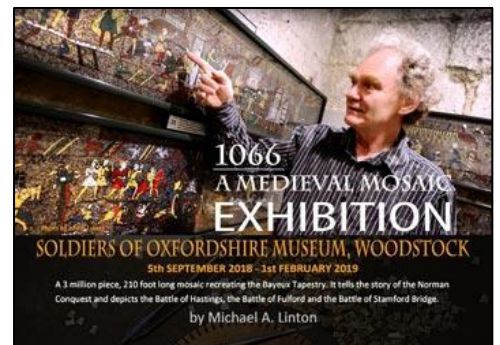
The British Motor Museum will be marking the 60th birthday of the iconic British car, the Mini, with a 2-day show on 3 and 4 August 2019. The event is timed for the weekend before the international Mini meet IMM in Bristol, to attract many of the hundreds of international visitors to stop off at the Cotswolds – and the British Motor Museum during their stay. The Museum will also be running a series of mini-themed family activities. A new exhibition will also be taking place at the British Motor Museum in June/July 2019 exploring the future of personal transport. www.britishmotormuseum.co.uk



Cogges Manor in Witney will receive a huge makeover in 2019 thanks to a £900k Heritage Lottery Fund award. The project will reveal Cogges' untold story for visitors, schools and community groups from across the county, including improvements to buildings and spaces, new displays and a programme of activities and events to encourage people to get more involved in their local history and environment. It will culminate in the building of a Saxon roundhouse, creating opportunities for volunteers and young people to gain new skills – securing the future of Cogges. www.cogges.org.uk/next-steps



From 1 February 2019 **The Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum** will be exhibiting 1066: A Medieval Mosaic – a re-creation of the Bayeux Tapestry handcrafted from 3 million pieces of spring steel. Created by Michael A. Linton, the 64 metre, 350kg mosaic took 33 years to complete and is listed in the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest of its kind. With extra sections depicting events leading up to the crowning of William the Conqueror on Christmas Day 1066, as well as the Battles of Fulford and Stamford Bridge, the mosaic will measure close to double the length of the real Bayeux Tapestry. www.soho.org.uk/bayeuxtapestry



2019 sees work to restore the oldest Tudor walled gardens in England. **Thornbury Castle's** Head Gardener Katie Engler is bringing the gardens and estate back to life as a productive and historically true Tudor garden. The project has already seen the creation of a working kitchen garden producing fruit and vegetables for the hotel restaurant and the start of a three-year orchard project planting heritage fruit varieties. In 2019 she plans to transform the Howard family graveyard, create a new camellia border within the rose garden and add a Victorian finch aviary, as well as renovating the garden shop so guests can buy their own honey, eggs and produce. www.thornburycastle.co.uk



Blenheim Palace has a whole host of new exhibitions, events, historic restoration and conservation projects and new tours for 2019. From February to April 2019, an exhibition of JMW Turner's early architectural paintings and engravings will be on show in the largest collection of his paintings ever to visit the Cotswolds. New tours include a return of the private apartment tours. And brand new for 2019 are the Twizy Tours – a fun way to explore the Capability Brown landscaped parkland from the comfort of a two-seater, electric vehicle. Popular events returning in 2019 include the Food Festival (May 25 – 27) and the Flower Show (June 21 – 23).

A two-week excavation is set to take place in May 2019 at **Sudeley Castle** to further explore a site which experts believe could reveal one of England's last surviving Tudor gardens – hidden in the castle grounds for nearly 300 years. Further explorations of a mound, discovered in the middle of the field, could also confirm that it was once the site of a temporary banqueting house and the location of a huge celebration by Elizabeth I as part of her progress around the country to mark her victory over the Spanish Armada. Members of the public are now being invited to join a team of archaeologists from social enterprise company, DigVentures, for the excavation in May, and help uncover more of the site's secrets. This discovery ties in beautifully with the 2019 Festival of Archaeology – part of the 75th anniversary of the Council for British Archaeology. www.sudeleycastle.co.uk

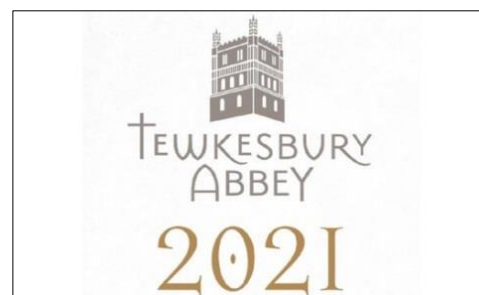
